Military Affairs Committees at all levels are responsible for setting up people's intelligence networks with patriotic civilians (farmers, laborers and workers) as backbone elements. Reliance upon the people will enable concerned agencies to take timely action against enemy plans, but special precautions must be taken against enemy deceptive measures.

Hamlet military intelligence agents are responsible for reporting enemy military operations, operating procedures, shortcomings and internal conflicts, planting agents inside enemy installations and cooperating with militiamen, guerrillas, military proselyting agents and security personnel.

The Hamlet People's Military Intelligence Element is subordinate to the Hamlet Military Affairs Committee but technically responsible to the Village People's Military Intelligence Element. It is under the command of the Assistant Hamlet Unit Leader and does not have an organization of its own but relies upon a permanent backbone network of agents from the various revolutionary groups, who gather all information collected by the people and forward them to higher echelon.

Each canal area must have two to three informants placed at the disposal of local guerrillas. In enemy base areas and where there are enemy posts, in-place agents must constantly follow up enemy moves and report them for timely counter-measures. In addition, local guerrillas and organic mobile and concentrated forces must have agents of their own to collect operational intelligence.

Regt.PLAN FOR 1965 COMBAT SUPPORT TRAINING

Originated on 16 March 1965 by the Artillery Section of Eastern Nambo Region Military Staff, for combat support units of the various provinces.

Purposes of this training are to promote loyalty to the Party and the revolutionary cause, make combat support cadre master the principles of infantry tactics (hit-and-run attack, raid, and raid in superior force) and provide soldiers and squad leaders with a solid background of combat tactics and techniques.

Emphasis is placed on political indoctrination, the infantry's role, combat tactics and techniques, training of gun section chiefs and gunners, and consistency with battlefield realities.

Time spent on each subject (mortar, recoilless rifle, machine gun): 2 1/2 months broken down as follows:

- Preparations : 15 days
- Military training : 38 days
- Political training : 22 days

Military training is further broken down as follows:

- Mortar (60-81mm)

- Common subjects (troops administration, guard and patrol, close order drill, rifle firing practice, grenade throwing, physical training): 21 hours

- Mechanical training and maintenance: 49 hrs
- Field exercises: 56 hours
- Firing practice: 63 hours
- Tactics: 35 hours

- Recoilless rifle, 57mm

- Common subjects: 21 hours
- Mechanical training and maintenance: 49 hours
- Field exercises: 56 hours
- Firing practice: 105 hours
- Tactics: 35 hours

- Machine gun (Browning, Mas, Maxim)

- Common subjects: 21 hours
- Mechanical training and maintenance: 49 hours
- Field exercises: 91 hours
- Firing practice: 70 hours
- Tactics: 35 hours
