

PLAN FOR SRAO PERSONNEL INNOCULATIONS

The following immunizations are required prior to assignment to the Far Eastern Area (including Vietnam). It is important that the injection series be started before a staff member comes to Washington for training and, if possible, the series (except for the Gamma Globulin and Tine Test) should be completed before a staff member reports for training.

BE SURE TO HAVE THE DOCTOR SIGN FOR EACH INJECTION GIVEN

X
1. SMALLPOX* (Live vaccine)

Beginning 1/1/67 and thereafter smallpox vaccinations must be recorded on International Certificate, revised 1966, and the origin, batch number, and date of expiration of the vaccine must be recorded by the administering doctor.

Written signature of the vaccinating physician must be stamped certified by local health authorities.

Given annually.

2. CHOLERA

Consists of two injections - 28 days apart and then booster every 3 months while in area.

Written signature of the physician must be stamped certified by local health authorities.

3. POLIO* (Live vaccine) Sabin type

Given orally in two doses at least eight weeks apart.

4. TYPHOID

Two injections in series - 28 days apart. Booster yearly.

5. TYPHUS

Two injections in series - 28 days apart. Booster yearly.

6. TETANUS TOXOID

Initial immunization of two injections four weeks apart, followed by a booster in one year. Thereafter, a booster is required at time of injury or every four years.

7. INFLUENZA

Given yearly - usually in the fall or winter.

8. TINE TEST

Will be given at Army Dispensary in Washington.

The following immunizations ARE REQUIRED for all persons going to Vietnam in addition to the others listed.

1. PLAGUE

Initial injection of 1.0 cc (IM). Second injection of 0.2 cc (IM) three months after initial injection. Booster of 0.2 cc required six months following second injection of basic series.

2. YELLOW FEVER* (Live vaccine)

One injection is good for 10 years and must be given at a USPH Yellow Fever Clinic. This immunization will be given in Washington, D.C. if there is not time or it is not available prior to reporting to NHQ.

3. GAMMA GLOBULIN

This inoculations must not be taken until you reach Washington. It will be given just before departing for overseas.

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* These vaccines (live) must be taken one at a time and at least one week apart.

You are required to use immunization card PHS 731, revised 9/66, for recording all immunizations.

Expenses incurred for immunizations may be reimbursed when vouchered with supporting receipts attached.
